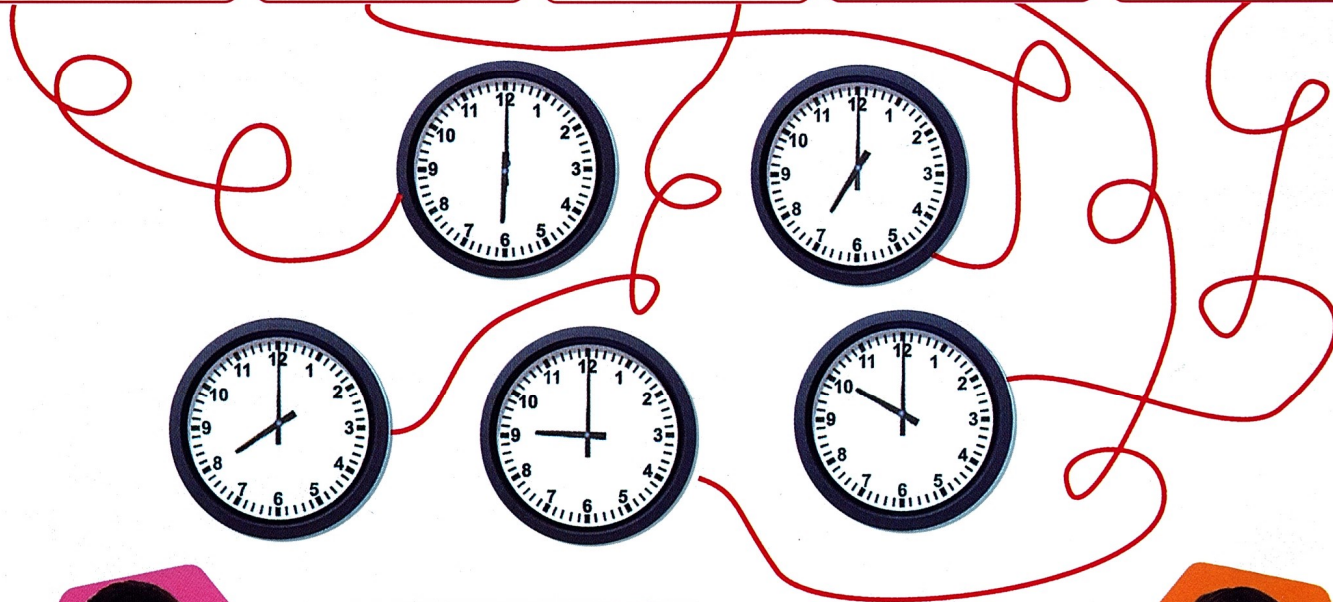
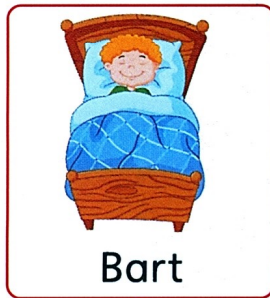
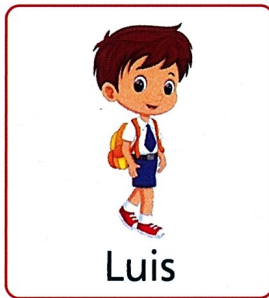
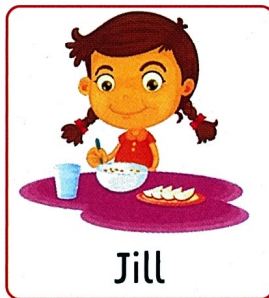
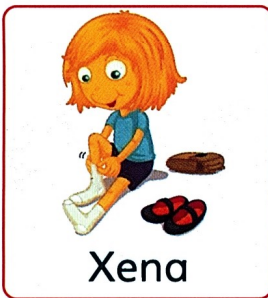
Many people believe that Stonehenge is a solar **calendar** / **watch**.
