In the past, people bought the things they needed at small shops near their house. You got bread in one shop and fruit in another. Now, people buy most of their food in a <u>supermarket</u> and their clothes in a big <u>department</u> store. But a small convenience store still sells basic things like milk and newspapers.

You can shop outdoors too. The fruit and vegetables at a farmers' market are very fresh! Eating outside at a street food stall is cheaper than going to a restaurant.

If you want to buy old things cheaply, you can go to a <u>flea market</u>. An <u>auction</u> is more expensive. At an auction, everyone says what they want to pay for an item and the person who offers the most money gets it!
