- We use the when there is only one place, person or thing: It was at the Birmingham Arena. (There's only one place with this name.)
- We use a / an to talk about a person, place or thing for the first time: Paul and I went to a concert last Saturday.
- We use the to talk about the person, place or thing again: (The concert) was fantastic!

TIP • We also use the in these phrases:

in the city centre

go to the cinema / theatre

in the morning / afternoon / evening

at the weekend
