


Typhoons and hurricanes

A really big snake

The python is the largest snake in the world.

Pythons live mostly in Africa and Asia where they enjoy the warm weather. The largest python ever found was 32 feet long. Another python weighed over 400 pounds! Pythons can live for 20 to 30 years.



The way a python eats is very different. It will wrap itself around an animal and squeeze it hard until the animal is dead. Pythons can eat large animals like goats, pigs and even deer. It takes a long time for a python to digest a large animal. Some pythons only eat four or five times in a year!

World languages

Did you know there are almost 7,000 "living" languages in the world? Languages have existed for thousands of years and one of the oldest written languages is Egyptian.

One country, Papua New Guinea, has over 820 different languages! Mandarin Chinese is spoken by more people than any other language. No one really knows the oldest spoken language, but the newest language, only about 100 years old, is Afrikaans, spoken in South Africa.

English has the most words, over 500,000, while Taki Taki, spoken in South America, has only 340 words. The language Rotokas has the smallest alphabet—only 12 letters.

If you are learning English, you are not alone. English is the world's most common second language, spoken by over 500 million people!
