The verb be is in the full form in affirmative short answers.

Is she wearing jeans?

Yes, she is. (NOT Yes, she is wearing.)

Are you doing your homework?

Yes, I am. (NOT Yes, I am doing.)

Is he doing his homework?

No, he isn't. (NOT No, he isn't doing.)

Are you going home?

No, I'm not. (NOT No, I'm not going.)

Is he sitting in the car? Yes, he is. Are they doing their homework? Yes, they are. Are we going to the cinema? No, we aren't.

6.4 Present continuous and present simple

I go to school every day.

I am going to school now.

Tony gets up at eight o'clock every day.

It is eight o'clock now. Tony is getting up.

The present continuous is used for actions which are happening now. We often use it with words like at the moment and now.

She is doing her homework now.

He is reading a book at the moment.

The present simple is used for a regular action. It is often used with phrases like every day, every morning, usually or all the time.

I **clean** my teeth **every morning**. We **go** to school **every day**.

Compare

She has a shower every day.

She is having a shower at the moment.

I play the piano every day.
I'm playing the piano at the moment.
