- 2 With verbs ending in a short vowel and one consonant, double the consonant and add -ed. I stopped the car.

- 3 With verbs ending in a short vowel and one consonant, double the consonant and add -ing. sit – sit**ting**
- 4 With verbs ending in -ie, remove -ie and add -ying. lie – l**ying**
