My first day





She's with her mummy, her daddy, her brother and her little sister, Twinkle.


'Come on, Twinkle!' says Star.

'Boo hoo!' she says.


'I don't want to go to playschool!'

Then Star's friends arrive.


'Who's this?' asks Twig.

'It's her first day at playschool.'




- 'This is my little brother, Flint,' says Twig.

'Goal!' calls Flint.




Star's Mummy, Granny and Grandad arrive.


'Do you like playschool?' asks Granny.






Oh dear, the robot's broken.

'Click click!'






Melody puts on the robot's hands. 'Click click!'

Rocket presses the red button on the robot.


'Beep! Beep! Beep!' says the robot.

'Beep! Beep! Beep!'




It's too noisy!






'Hello everyone,' says the teacher.

'Yes, good idea Melody,' says the teacher.




'Twig, the trumpet's too noisy.

Shake! Shake!




'Rocket, the drum's too noisy.

Melody plays the piano. Plinkety plonk! And the teacher plays the guitar. Twang! 'Ready? Let's play!' says the teacher.













It's playtime.

- 'Choo choo!'




Star is playing with the car.

'Climb in!' says Star.'Beep beep!'




'Beep beep!' says Star.

'Watch out!' calls Melody.




But the train crashes into the table.

'Let's look!' says Rocket.




'Ooh! What's that?' asks Rocket.

'Oh no! Is it a monster?' asks Melody.




'Hee hee! It's not a monster!' says Star.

'Yum yum,' says Twig.'I'm hungry!'




Melody takes the cheese and tomatoes.

'Great,' says Twig. 'I'm thirsty!'




'What have you got, Twig?' asks Rocket. 'I've got a bag of nuts,' says Twig.

'I love nuts!'


'Me too,' says Rocket.

'Oh no,' says Twig. 'And I'm so hungry!'




The birds are eating the nuts.

'Oh yes,' says Twig.


'And they like nuts! Hee hee!'
